Words ending in '-cious' or '-tious'

Rule: If the root word ends in **–ce** (e.g. vice or grace), the spelling is normally **'-cious'**, e.g. **vicious** or **gracious**. Otherwise, **'-tious'** is normally used.

Words ending in '-cial' or '-tial'

Rule: '-cial' is common after a **vowel**, e.g. facial, whereas '-tial' is common after a consonant, e.g. substantial. **Exceptions:** financial (from the root word 'finance', commercial (from the root word 'commerce')

Words ending in '-ant' or '-ent'

Rule: '-ant' is mostly used when the root word can end in 'ation', e.g. observant because observation is a word, or expectant because expectation is a word.

'ent' is mostly used after a soft 'c', 'g', or 'qu' sound, e.g. decent and frequent.

Exceptions: assistant, obedient, independent

Words ending in '-able' or '-ible'

Rule: '-able' is used mostly when there is an independent root word, e.g. <u>comfortable</u>, <u>understandable</u>. Whereas, '-ible' is normally used where there is no root word.

Exceptions: sensible.

Words ending in '-fer' or '-ferr'

Rule: '-fer' is used when the 'r' sound is **not** stressed, e.g. reference has a '**short** r' sound. '-ferr' ised used when the 'r' sound **is** stressed, e.g. preferred.

Use of the hyphen

Rule: A hyphen is normally used to join a prefix to a root word when the prefix **ends** in a <u>vowel</u> and the root word **begins** with the **same** <u>vowel</u>, e.g. 're-enter'.

Prefixes 'ex-' and 'self-' are often followed by a hyphen too.
