

They can identify when they were successful and what they need to do to improve. Pupils can pass and receive the ball with some control under pressure. They tag opponents and close down space. Pupils know what position they are playing in and how to contribute when attacking and defending. They know the need for tactics and can identify when to use them in different situations. Pupils know there are different skills for different situations and are beginning to apply this.	Hockey In this unit pupils will improve their defending and attacking skills playing even-sided games. They will start to show control and fluency in dribbling, sending and receiving a ball in a small game situation and under some pressure. Pupils will be encouraged to think about how to use tactics and collaborate with others to outwit their opposition. Pupils will comment on their own and other's performances and suggest ways to improve. They will also recognise the importance of fair play and honesty while self-managing games. Indoor PE – dance Pupils learn different styles of dance, working individually, as a pair and in small groups. In dance as a whole, pupils think about how to use movement to explore and communicate ideas and issues, and their own feelings and thoughts. As they work, they develop an awareness of the historical and cultural origins of different dances. Pupils will be provided with the opportunity to create and perform their work. They will be asked to provide feedback using the correct dance terminology and will be able to use this feedback to improve their work. Pupils will work safely with each other and show respect towards others.
