Year 1 Notices

Reading Day – Books are changed on Mondays.

Please ensure that your child brings in their reading books and reading records each day. We ask that you sign your child's reading record each day when you hear them read.

Library Day – Friday

Please ensure your child brings in their black school bag, if they have one, if not, the red bag can also be used, every Friday. They then have the opportunity to choose a book from the new Library and share it with you at home for a week.

P.E Days – Year 1 have PE on Mondays and Tuesdays. Please make sure your child wears PE clothes when coming to school on PE days. Correct PE kit must be worn- <u>black shorts</u>, <u>white t-shirt</u>, black trainers/plimsoles, <u>black tracksuit</u> top and bottoms (without logos)

In this booklet you will find seven weeks' worth of spellings. You need to learn these spellings carefully by using the look, say, cover and write method. Towards the end of this half term, we are concentrating on the common exception words (high frequency words) that all year 1 children should be able to read and write correctly before the end of July.

Your teacher will test you on your spellings each week on Wednesday.

At the end of this booklet is a list of the 100 High Frequency words for year 1. It is expected that the children are able to read and write the majority of these before going up to year 2.

Curriculum information Pentecost 2

Religious Education

Dialogue and encounter: this topic involves meeting Christians from the local parish, including the parish priest and understanding what being a Christian means to them and how they live their lives. Looking at the church to understand the building as a place where Catholics gather to celebrate their love of Christ in the church's liturgies. Pupils will develop an understanding that the Christian family extends beyond their immediate experience. Pupils will begin learning about Judaism through understanding of the Jewish belief in one God and that they have a sacred text, the Torah. The Torah contains stories, laws, and poetry which are central to Jewish culture.

English:

The children will study a "wishing tale" and will focus on "The Magic Paintbrush." We will look at the cultural aspect of the book and how good overcomes evil. They will continue to practise their handwriting, spellings and grammar in all subjects.

<u>Maths</u>

Position and direction: the children will learn about how to describe turns (full, quarter, half, three quarter), describe position – left, right, forwards, backwards, above and below. They will discuss ordinal numbers

Place value within 100: the children will practise counting from 50 to 100 in ones, then in tens. They will learn how to partition numbers into tens and ones as well as look at the number line to 100, using this to establish 1 more and 1 less than a given number. They will compare numbers with the same number of tens as well as any two numbers.

Money: the children will learn unitising, for example a 5 pence coin represents five 1 pence coins. One item does not need to represent a value of one. They will learn to recognise coins and notes in current circulation and how to count in coins by using their knowledge of the values of coins to solve problems by counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Time: the children will focus on the language of before and after. Learn the order of the days of the week and months of the year. Discuss the language of time (hours, minutes and seconds) and begin to learn to tell the time to the hour and to the half hour

<u>Science</u>

The children's last year 1 topic will be about plants. The children will study how plants grow, which plants grow in our local area and the structure of a plant (root, stem/stalk, leaves and flowers)

Geography

What is it like to live in Shanghai: in this topic the pupils will learn about human and physical features of their local area. They will use an atlas to locate the UK and China on a world map and then be able to compare differences and similarities between Shanghai and their own local area.


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Making smoothies: in this topic the children will learn to describe fruits and vegetables and explain how to identify them. Name a range of places that fruits and vegetables grow. Describe basic characteristics of fruit and vegetables. Prepare fruits and vegetables to make a smoothie.

Computing

Grouping data: in this topic the children will be exploring object labels, then using them to sort and group objects by properties.




