
## **School Uniform and bags**

- After Easter as it is summer term so the children can wear their summer uniform, please check online at the uniform section on the Our Lady of peace website for the summer uniform.
- The weather is warming up a little now but it is still very rainy and windy on
  occasions so please remember to send your child in with a suitable rain coat as
  we play and learn outside daily.
- If you have not done so already, please send your child in with a pair of clearly labelled wellies.
- Please label your child's uniform. please may we also ask that children wear school shoes, not trainers.
- Please provide a bag of spare clothes, as sometime children may need to change, due to a toileting accident/ engaging in messy/water play throughout the day.
- Please send your child to school with their reading books in their maroon book bag every day. They take home letters and any crafts they have done in their book bags too.
- Remember to send your child with a labelled water bottle every day.

**Phonics** 



This half term we will continue to look at phase 1 elements of phonics in addition to continuing to learn our next first few phonics sounds over the half term of 'f', 'ff', 'l', 'ss' and 'le'



This week we will be recapping the sounds we learnt last half term through different phonic and fine motor opportunities in the class room activities and playing phase 1 sound games.

We will also be learning the new sound 'f' as in fish.

Please remember to read with your child and sign their reading record book each time. Please read the book with your child multiple times over the week. You can split the book over several sittings. Discussing 3 pages each night for example. Please bring the reading record and book in daily in the maroon book bag. Children's books will be changed on Thursdays/Fridays.

The lilac books are wordless to build up spoken vocabulary and storytelling language. Discuss the pictures in the book and allow them to make up the story from what they can see encouraging the use of full sentences. There are also comprehension questions at the backs of the books which will give you an idea of some of the question you can ask your child when reading with them.

## Literacy




In Literacy this term we will be focusing on stories about growth and change. We will be beginning the term by reading 'Rosie's Walk' by Pat Hutchins and 'Where oh where is Rosie's Chick?' by Pat Hutchins. We will be thinking about all of the different positional lanauage we hear in these two stories as well as beginning to

explore the lifecycle of a chicken.



At home draw a map and follow it together thinking of all of the different positional language as you go e.g. around, under, over. Think about how you can make marks on the paper to represent the directions you are traveling in and the landmarks on the map

## **Maths**



In maths this week we will be learning about sequencing by sequencing the parts of the stories we are learning involving Rosie. We will be thinking abot the

sequence of events we each go through each day and at school.



At home think about your daily routine what do you do first, next, after and finally in your day.


RE

Over the course of the term we will be looking at growth ad change and learning about lots of different lifecycles including the lifecycle of a bean and the lifecycle of a chicken.
