French at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Primary & Nursery School

<u>Intent</u>

The teaching of French at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Primary School provides an opening to other cultures and helps to foster pupils' curiosity and understanding of the world. It provides the foundation for further study of languages during secondary education and also contributes to equipping pupils to be able to study and work in other countries in the future. At OLOP, we have chosen to study French. We follow the Rigolo scheme of work which provides a sequence of lessons taught in themes across Key Stage 2 providing a progressive build-up of skills in line with the National Curriculum, which provides opportunities to:

- Listen to and respond to spoken and written language in a variety of contexts.
- Use songs and rhymes to explore patterns and sounds of language and link these to meaning of words and spelling.
- Have the opportunity to engage in conversations; asking and answering questions, expressing opinions and responding to others and being able to speak with increasing confidence, fluency and spontaneity, accuracy of pronunciation and intonation to a range of audiences.
- Have opportunities to broaden their vocabulary and be able to use it to describe people, places, things and actions both orally and in writing.
- Understand basic grammar, how it differs from English and be able to apply it to build sentences.
- Discover and develop an appreciation of a range of writing in French

<u>Implementation</u>

Our scheme of work is broadly based on the Rigolo scheme of work. Lessons are sequenced to introduce and build up new vocabulary knowledge and skills progressively through the scheme with planned opportunities to revisit language and grammar. Lessons consist of the use of presentations, audio files using native French speakers. Lessons are taught weekly with short opportunities throughout the week to recap on vocabulary, main teaching points, and to practice oral skills through songs and rhymes. In lower Key Stage 2, children acquire basic skills and understanding with a strong emphasis on speaking and listening. This is further embedded throughout upper Key Stage 2 alongside opportunities for reading and writing, gradually progressing to more complex concepts of language development.

Impact
