Your teacher will test you on your spellings each week on Monday.




Your project for this half-term involves staying safe in the sun.

Maths for Pentecost 1

Measurement: Weight and Volume

Measure and begin to record mass/weight, capacity and volume. Compare, describe and solve practical problems for mass/weight: [for example, heavy/light, heavier than, lighter than]; capacity and volume [for example, full/empty, more than, less than, half, half full, quarter]

Multiplication and division

For Year 1, this topic covers: recap on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Making equal groups and adding equal groups. Making arrays, making doubles, making equal groups – grouping and making equal groups – sharing. This is in preparation for year 2 when the children will start to learn their "times tables".

Fractions:

Recognise and find a half of an object or a shape. Recognise and find half of a quantity, Recognise and find a quarter of an object or a shape. Recognise and find a quarter of a quantity.

Geometry: Position and direction:

Describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three quarter turns

In English, for the first four weeks of the term we are looking at "Cinderella" (a rags to riches tale.) We will be focussing on using adjectives to describe characters as well as exploring the characters feelings and emotions. Please encourage your child to think of exciting adjectives for use in their spelling sentences and discuss the characters in the stories they read at home.

After that we are looking at a non-chronological report about a famous person. We will look at the structure of a report and the type of vocabulary used.

We will continue to look at sentence structure and the correct use of capital letters, finger spaces and punctuation including full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.

We will also continue to practice the high frequency words, both in our reading and writing.
