This week the children have been mastering the art of sorting numbers 4 and 5, as well as developing their subitising skills up to 5. In the festive spirit, the children have been immersed in Christmas crafts, creating beautiful decorations and spreading joy. Uniform and book bags

- · Please send your child to school with a suitable coat and a pair of clearly labelled wellies.

Floppy Phonics

In our phonics sessions, the children have been diligently exploring the sounds 'le' and 'ss'. The children are continuing to make good progress in recognising and using these sounds in their reading and writing activities.

Next week the children will be focusing on the 'j' and 'v' phonemes.

To further support your child's phonics journey, we encourage you to continue reading and writing CVC/CVCC. (C-Consonant, V-Vowel)

Here are ten words for you to practise with your child:

Little, muddle, pickle, dress, mess, bless, cuddle, hiss, boss and less.

Reading Books

We would recommend your child should read each day in addition to being read too. Reading is more than simply reciting the text on the page. Please create discussions regarding what your child has read with comprehensive questions.

Questions such as

(Vocabulary)What does the word..... mean?

Can you retell and sequence the story?

(Prediction) Can you predict what might happen next?

(Inference) Why do you think....

(Explain) Can you explain how that character may be feeling?

(Retrieval) Where in the story would I find the information about.....? Beginning, middle, end.

PE

Our PE sessions have been full of Christmas cheer as the children dance happily to holiday music. They're doing a great job following directions, moving together, and being aware of the friends around them. We're impressed with how they respect each other's personal space while having fun.
