Welcome to Year 2!

We are so delighted to start the new school year and can't wait to dive into some exciting topics with your children. Below is some key information to help you support your child at home.

Spellings

Overleaf you'll find our spelling list for this half term. Each week, the children will complete a short spelling test on **Friday**.

We will practise these spellings in school, but daily practice at home is also encouraged. We've included some helpful ideas for practising at home.

If the sheet gets misplaced, don't worry - it's always available on the **school website**.

Times Tables

This term, we are focusing on the **2s and 5s times tables**. In Year 1, the children explored these through repeated addition and counting in multiples.

In Year 2, we'll be using **songs, rhymes, chanting**, and **fun activities** to help them memorise and understand their times tables.

Ideas for home:

- Listen to times tables songs in the car
- Stick post-it notes around the house (e.g. bathroom mirror!)
- Make it part of your daily routine

Books

Children should bring their **reading book** and **reading record** to school **every day**. Reading books will be changed on **Tuesdays**.

Your child will also have the opportunity to choose a **library book**, which can be changed on **Fridays**, if needed.

Please support your child by reading with them regularly at home and signing their reading record. Just a few minutes a day makes a big difference!
