
You can present it in any way you like; handwritten or typed on a computer, pictures you have created or printed, or anything else you can think of! We look forward to seeing your creations!


Maths for Lenten Term 2

Fractions

The children will start on fractions and being able to recognise them in different ways. They will learn to find quarters, halves, three quarters and thirds. They will know that 2 halves make a whole and that 2 quarters make a half. They will find unit fraction (e.g. ½, where the numerator is 1) and non-unit fraction (where the numerator is 2 or more, e.g. ¾). If they know one part and how many parts there are they can then find the whole. (If I have 4 parts and each part has 2, then the whole is 8)




They will find a fraction of a shape, an amount or of a number. With numbers sometimes this will have a visual prompt to support, other times it will be without. The children can draw to help them solve, but we will also be linking this to our times tables, as a fraction can be found by dividing.



<u>Time</u>

The children will move onto telling the time. Last year they would have been taught o'clock and half past. Now the children will initially move onto quarter past and quarter to; before then moving onto reading time in 5 minute intervals. They will also learn to recognise minutes in an hour, hours in a day and compare durations of time which ask both minutes and time. For example, which is longer 1 hour or 70 minutes?



In preparation for the assessments the children will be revising and practising strategies taught throughout the year for the different areas of maths, but especially number in order to put them in the best position to show their true potential.


