Year 1 Notices

Reading Day – Books are changed on Mondays.

Please ensure that your child brings in their reading books and reading records each day. We ask that you sign your child's reading record each day when you hear them read.

Library Day – Friday

Please ensure your child brings in their black school bag, if they have one, if not, the red bag can also be used, every Friday. They then have the opportunity to choose a book from the new Library and share it with you at home for a week.

Your project for this half-term involves staying safe in the sun.



Curriculum information Pentecost 1

Religious Education

<u>To the ends of the earth:</u> This topic focuses on the events which happen after Easter and Holy week. The stories the children will study include Jesus' resurrection on the third day, the journey on the road to Emmaus, the story of Ascension and Pentecost as well as learning and discussing how the Holy Spirit works within us and how we can carry on Gods work in our everyday lives. The children will look at the importance of these events and they fitted in to God's plan for his world.

English:

The children will study the text "Cinderella" where they will start to learn the structure and detail of a "rags to riches" tale, and the language and vocabulary used in this style of story. They will continue to work on their handwriting as well as spelling, grammar and punctuation. They will continue to apply their phonics knowledge in their reading and writing in all areas of the curriculum.

Maths

Multiplication and division

For Year 1, this topic covers: recap on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Making equal groups and adding equal groups. Making arrays, making doubles, making equal groups by grouping and making equal groups by sharing. This is in preparation for year 2 when the children will start to learn their "times tables".

Fractions:

Recognise and find a half of an object or a shape. Recognise and find half of a quantity, Recognise and find a quarter of an object or a shape. Recognise and find a quarter of a quantity.

Phonics

<u>Science</u>

The children will continue to study the topic of Everyday Materials in which they will look at objects and the materials they are made of, examining the properties of these materials and why they are suited to the objects made from them.

History

Mary Seacole: the children will study the life of Mary Seacole and why she plays an important part in the History of nursing. They will compare nursing in the past and present.

<u>Art</u>

Playful creating: the children will look at how sculptures are created before using found materials to create their own medal and sculpture.

Computing

Programming animations: Designing and programming the movement of a character on screen to tell stories.
