## **School Uniform and bags**

### **Phonics**



This half term we will continue to look at phase 1 elements of phonics in addition to continuing to learn our next first few phonics sounds.



This week we will be recapping the sounds we learnt last half term through different phonic and fine motor opportunities in the class room activities and playing phase 1 sound games.

We will also be learning the new sound 'v' as in van.


Please remember to read with your child and sign their reading record book each time. Please read the book with your child multiple times over the week. You can split the book over several sittings. Discussing 3 pages each night for example. Please bring the reading record and book in daily in the maroon book bag. Children's books will be changed on Thursdays/Fridays.

The lilac books are wordless to build up spoken vocabulary and storytelling language. Discuss the pictures in the book and allow them to make up the story from what they can see encouraging the use of full sentences. There are also comprehension questions at the backs of the books which will give you an idea of some of the question you can ask your child when reading with them.

#### Literacy



In Literacy we will be continuing to look at the lifecycles of plants and the book Jasper's Beanstalk by Nick Butterworth. We will be retelling the story and thinking about the beginning, middle and end and trying to use the sequence of this story to help support us with understanding the growth of plants and how we look after plants.



Nursery would continue to appreciate any donations of seeds, beans, soil and plants so we can be budding growers and gardeners this half term.

#### **Maths**



In maths this week we will be continuing sequencing. This week we will be looking back at the story and see what Jasper did each day of the week. We will then be sequencing the days of the week in the right order. We will also explore other stories with are sequenced in line with the days of the week such at the very hungry caterpillar.



At home talk about the different days as the week go and try and remember what order the days of the week goes

in. Can your child sing you the days of the week or the months of the year song from Nursery?

#### RE



We will be continuing our new topic To the ends of the earth this half term in Nursery. This week we will be focusing on Jesus's friends and disciples. We will be thinking about what it means to be a good friend. We will be reflecting back on all of the stories we have heard about Jesus' life and thinking about what Jesus' friends would have shared about Jesus and how he wanted us to be



At home think about the life of Jesus. What stories can you remember? Where was Jesus born? What did Jesus want to teach people?



This week we will be exploring the life cycles of plants and will be planting and watching the growth of our own bean plants in class.

If you are able to donate any plant or vegetable seeds, soil or any other gardening related equipment the Nursery will be very appreciative.
