### Welcome to your homework booklet for this half term.



In this booklet you will find five weeks' worth of spellings. You need to learn these spellings carefully by using the look, say, cover and write method. The spellings will focus on the common exception words (high frequency words) that all year 1 children should be able to read and write correctly before the end of July, as well as words associated with the phonics we are currently learning at school.

Your teacher will test you on your spellings each week on Monday.

You will soon be given details of how to log on to Spelling Shed for more fun games to play that will help your child with spellings.



Your project for this half-term will focus our current science topic: Animals including humans.

We would like you to choose two or three animals and create a fact sheet in your homework book about each one. You could include information about their habitat, food and families. You also might want to include picture (drawings and or photographs). Make them as creative as you can!

Parents, we would like the children to complete the homework as independently as possible. By all means help them with the research but the completion of the project should be the child's own work.

Pupils will soon be given log in details for Purple Mash. Use your Purple Mash login to explore the site, play games, draw pictures and learn about famous people in History.


#### Maths for Advent Term 1

- Given a number, identifying one more or one less.
- Identifying and representing numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.


