Dear Parents,

Hoping you have all had a good week.

In school, the week started with a special retreat day led by the Sion group. This was arranged with Rev Anthony at Our Lady of Peace Parish as part of their mission week. Upper school heard scripture about Adam and Eve and began to think about when we sin, Jesus creates that link to bring us closer back to God. There is also a parent update meeting for all parents on 1st April 2025 at 5:30pm regarding the school and plans moving forward. Please do attend this meeting if you can.



Spotlight on Psychology Services

Gary Nixon Educational Psychologist

Gary is an outstanding leader in education, health and children's services environments and is the Principal Educational and Child Psychologist here in Slough. He has previously held senior leadership positions in Shire, City and London Borough Areas and is a respected school leader, holding positions across all areas of SEND and learning, with specialist expertise in applied psychology, educational and organizational leadership and school improvement.

Within his professional life, Gary continues to influence national policy developments and is very passionate about the offer provided to our SEND young people, who are the heart of what we do as a service and why we do what we do. All Educational Psychology work relates to the key themes of the SEND Code of Practice, including assessment of children and young people, which recognises the unique nature of every child and their unique individual circumstance. The Psychology Team, work with young people and their families to draw information together to develop a formulation of their strengths, needs and aspirations.

With this information Gary works to find the right approach to interventions and the support that would be helpful and beneficial going forward. This includes preparation of psychological advice to the authority as part of Education Health Care (EHC) needs assessments and supporting the council to understand needs and provision if a change of placement



or provision is requested or required. Our SEND young people deserve an inclusive service, where their needs are recognised, understood and form part of what we put in place to help them succeed in education.

Sign up to Slough Children's Disability Register!

Sign up to Slough Children's Disability Register to receive a Max card and to receive information on services in Slough!

Slough's Childrens Disability Register is an online register which captures information about children and young people, aged 0-25 years, with disabilities or special educational needs in Slough. The information that you give us will be used anonymously to show the use of and demand for services in Slough.

On registering your child's details, you will be given the option to receive a Max Card.

The Max Card is a national, local authority-commissioned discount initiative for looked after children and children with additional needs aged 0-25 years. The scheme enables families to visit hundreds of attractions across the UK at a free or discounted rate.

- for details and a list of venues. In Slough, your child might be eligible for a Max Card if they:
- have an EHC plan
- receive DLA
- have a letter of diagnosis of substantial and long-term mental impairment from CAMHS
- have medical proof of a physical impairment that has a long-term effect on ability to do normal daily activities.

This register is for Slough Borough Council residents only.

Registration on Slough Children's Disability Register is not a requirement to obtain any services in Slough and equally does not constitute automatic entitlement to any services. To find out more and to register: Slough Information and Services Guide | Slough Children's Disability Register

SEND Area Inspection update

As our previous newsletters have highlighted, we are preparing for our local area inspection of the services and provision for our children and young people with SEND. We are currently in the process of refining our area strengths, and areas for further development.

We have significant strengths in our Early Years Education sector, our Children's Centres (who were recently inspected by Ofsted and rated Good and Outstanding!) and in the performance of our schools and colleges across the borough. We are keen to further improve the consistency of communication and the timeliness of our assessments across SEND and the Health Teams, working closely with partners such as Special Voices, schools, and other professionals.

We are a service committed to positive change, which won't happen overnight, but we are confident that the improvements will benefit our SEND young people and families, who deserve a better service. There is also a dedicated page on Slough Borough Council's website that relates to Ofsted's initial report on SEND and our written statement of action, which highlights the areas identified for improvement. This video is a recording of one of four virtual roadshows on the area SEND inspection framework. Watch the recording to find out about the changes under the existing framework, how Ofsted gather evidence on inspection and measure the service that you rely on.

We meet with our Ofsted colleagues regularly to measure our progress and to seek their advice on what meaningful changes can be made to keep us on track to a positive inspection. Be assured that work is happening every day on improvements, even if we don't announce it. For us improvement should not be a one-off event, but rather form part of our standard practice on a daily basis, ensuring that we are fit for purpose and evolving our SEND Local Offer.

Via our newsletter - we will take the regular opportunity to update you on the continued meaningful improvement plans and ideas, shaping your SEND service.

Core to this, is the priority of the overall stability of the team and ensuring that we recruit and maintain staffing levels, that not just deliver the statutory service that you deserve, but also enables us to implement and progress the service improvements that we would like to see, as part of your evervdav service.

Nationally there is a high demand for SEND Case Officers which leads to local and national competition in the recruitment market place. This is a challenge which we are determined to overcome.

It is incredibly important for us to continue to select the right people for our service, who can bring with them the knowledge and expertise that will directly benefit our families.

We will be recruiting to further posts in 2025 and we are excited to update you in upcoming newsletters to our progress.


