


As we enter into this special time of preparation in school and at home. We would like to share our Advent Calendar that we will be following in school. There is a digital and printable version for you to share as a family.

1st Sunday of Advent Today's reading from the Prophet Isaiah speaks of a time when people will hammer swords and spears into what? + Isaiah 2:1-5  30	An Advent wreath's circular shape and evergreen leaves are signs of God's unending love. What might the candles be a sign of?  1	Advent is a waiting time. Waiting for good things isn't easy, but prayer helps. Today, ask God to help you wait patiently for Christmas Day.  2	Listen to our Advent carol <i>We are Waiting</i> .* Try learning the carol, as a way to help you get ready for Jesus!  3	GLOBAL FAMILY FACT: During Advent in the Philippines, homes are decorated with paper lanterns called Paroles. They are to light the way for Jesus.*  4	Make a Mission Together Star of Hope today, and think about how you can bring hope to others in Advent.*  5	Write an Advent prayer or poem. Try to include the words: Advent, hope, wait, light, God, Jesus, love.  6
2nd Sunday of Advent Today's reading from the Prophet Isaiah speaks of God's kingdom. How does the prophet describe God's peaceful kingdom? + Isaiah 11:1-10  7	In this 2 nd week of Advent we think about peace. Today spend a moment remembering children who live in war zones. Ask God to keep them in His care.  8	One way we prepare for Jesus is by being peacemakers. Make a Mission Together Peace Paper-chain. On each link write ways you can build peace.*  9	Listen carefully to the carol <i>Silent Night</i> . This peaceful carol once stopped soldiers fighting. Try singing along, too.*  10	Make peace today. Say sorry to someone you may have upset this week; or forgive someone who has upset you.  11	GLOBAL FAMILY FACT: Tomorrow is the feast of St Lucy. In Denmark, children join candle-lit processions to honour St Lucy, and as a sign of the light that Jesus brings.*  12	Today, find somewhere peaceful to sit and thank God for the people who love and care for you.  13
3rd Sunday of Advent Today's reading from Isaiah speaks of the joy that God's love brings. How can you share that joy today? + Isaiah 35: 1-6a, 10-14  14	Yesterday was Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice! The pink candle lit on the Advent wreath is also a sign of joy. Why is there a growing sense of joy?  15	GLOBAL FAMILY FACT: Mauke is an island in Oceania. As Christmas nears, Christians there share the joy of Jesus' birth by giving food hampers to strangers.*  16	Today, make a Mission Together Joyful Paper Angel and think about how you can share the joy of Jesus' birth with others.*  17	Joy is easy to pass on! Look out for people who are lonely today and invite them to play.  18	Singing helps us to feel joyful – especially when we sing with others. Try singing the carol <i>Joy to the World</i> today.*  19	Today, say a prayer for children who are sad or lonely. Ask God to help you share His joy with them.  20
4th Sunday of Advent In today's reading from the Gospel of St Matthew, what does God's angel say to Joseph? + Matthew 1:18-24  21	Christmas is a time for welcoming visitors – Jesus himself is coming! Today, ask your parents if you can help them get things ready for Christmas Day.  22	Around the world, billions of people are preparing for the birth of Jesus. Today, say the Our Father for those in our global family who need God's help today.  23	GLOBAL FAMILY FACT: In DR Congo (Africa), people of all ages will take part in big nativity plays this evening. Can you share the Christmas story with someone today, too?*  24	Rejoice! Jesus is born! Remember to thank God, and your family, for all the gifts their love brings.  25	<small>Cross symbol + refers to scriptures found in our Advent Celebrations of the Word.
