Maths overview

Addition and Subtraction

Children will learn to add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally. Keys skills this term will be adding and subtracting a two-digit number and ones, a two-digit number and tens. Moving onto adding and subtracting two two-digit numbers and adding three onedigit numbers.

Children will continue to learn how to solve problems with addition and subtraction using various methods. Also applying their increasing knowledge of mental and written methods.

Children will remember their learning about place value and use this knowledge to support their maths reasoning skills. Children can now recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones). Including Learning how to compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; using greater than, less than and equal to symbols.

Shape

Children will correctly identify and describe the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes, including the number of sides and line symmetry in a vertical line. They will identify 2-D shapes on the surface of 3-D shapes, [for example, a circle on a cylinder and a triangle on a pyramid] and compare and sort common 2-D shapes and everyday objects. Children will continue to use their knowledge of shape to name common 3-D shapes [for example, cuboids (including cubes), pyramids and spheres].

Learning to order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences, building on their knowledge to use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement, including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anticlockwise).

Every child should also have received a log in to Numbots. Please let your class teacher know if you need another copy.
